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THE BRIGHTER SIDE OF CONFLICT

From time to time, we find our community in one form or another of controversy and conflict. A lot of us wonder why this transpires in a communion of Christian believers whose main preoccupation is to love God above all and our neighbor as ourselves. As the Body of Christ, bound by the same love for God and united in heart, mind and spirit in our vision, mission and charism, we should be able to renew and reconcile our relationships without suppressing our differences, without anyone becoming more dominant, without having any losers or winners but just have one body that seeks to please God above all.

Wherever two or three are gathered, there is the need for organization. Where the two or three become two or three hundred or even a thousand, conflicts are bound to arise and the need for a more precise and effective organization becomes a necessity. But in all these, let us remember that when two or three are gathered in prayer and in Christ's Name then He is amongst them.

The brighter side of conflict comes about only if resolution is done in prayerful discernment and complete surrender to the Father's will!

The brighter side of conflict – change, unity, spiritual growth, deepening of loving relationships - will be upon us if we bring glory to God by demonstrating His love.
