Let us pray and ask God to guide our actions, sustain us when we are discouraged and enable us to be humble and cheerful givers as a proud man can never serve his neighbor. We must regularly confess our sins and receive the Holy Eucharist so that God's grace may enrich our spirit, goodness will flow through us and we will never grow weary in our works of charity!

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
