Dear Disciples of Christ,

The BLD Word Ministry is entrusted with propagating the Word of God through written and spoken means. Hence, this new Word Ministry blog was created with this main objective in mind: to nurture and promote the love of the Gospel in the service of the New Evangelization. Its immediate audience is the BLD community, both local and global.
